Hunt Institute Will Present "Botanical Paintings by James Linton Sain"

Pittsburgh — The Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation at Carnegie Mellon University will present fifty paintings in gouache by artist James Linton Sain of Lovingson, Virginia, from 12 April to 30 July 1999.

Sain's Great White Trillium triptych was in the Institute's *6th International Exhibition of Botanical Art & Illustration* in 1988, and since that time, Sain has continued to develop as an exceptional botanical artist. He has had one-person exhibitions at the Terrebonne Museum, Houma, Louisiana; Historic Kenmore Museum, Fredericksburg, Virginia; American Horticultural Society, Mount Vernon, Virginia; Adams Davidson Galleries, Washington, D.C.; U.S. National Arboretum, Washington, D.C.; Maier Museum, Randolph-Macon Woman's College, Lynchburg, Virginia; and Wintergreen Mountain Village, Wintergreen, Virginia.
